
WHY?

WHAT?

Every 2nd Sunday night of the month, our community will share in a family-style dinner provided by volunteers from our church. For those desiring to stay only for dinner, we will begin serving at 5:30. 6 pm remains for those staying for the entirety. On the remaining nights, rather than amassing a full dinner, we'll serve drinks (including coffee, tea & water) along with desserts provided by volunteers from the church. Focusing on serving something lighter these other nights will lessen the burden of cooking for such large numbers. The dessert time will still retain the value of engaging "family time" with extended conversations with the various people in our community.

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WHY?

Sharing a meal offers a valuable "family time". A relationally healthy family sits down not only to share in the pragmatism of a meal, but to share life and more fully connect. Of course, pragmatically speaking, it simply offers a meal for those in a rush to feed their families or those who would otherwise go without.

DO WHAT?

Setup volunteers arrive at 4:30. Tasks: making coffee and tea, warming food, putting linens on the table and setting out dishes. Clean-up volunteers tasks: washing dishes, putting linens in the wash, wiping down the serving table and sweeping the floors.

HOW MANY Volunteers DO WE NEED? *EACH WEEK

WHAT?

We will open our building for our and have some basic needs met including the following: laundry, showers, haircuts, check email, get help with job applications, receive fresh clothes (as needed), hang out/ watch tv/games, get basic snacks/ drinks. Ideally (based on volunteer response), we will be open from 2 pm-8 pm on Thursdays.

WHY?

We all deserve a shower, clean clothes and a fresh start. At most laundromats or other places that would enable thess opportunities, the homeless are generally unwel-

come. We want to create an inviting space where people can feel comfortable coming to get cleaned up, hang ing to do anything in return. Further, we believe that since we have the resources, we have the opportunity to be Jesus by giving freely. Jesus talked about serving the poor more than anything and this is our oppor-tunity to line out that tunity to live out that command.

DO WHAT?

We need at least 1 male and 1 female to shower and do laundry, helping fill out any applications and/or paperwork, help answer computer questions, hangout and be friendly.

WHAT?

(at 6 pm), we serve a meal under the Broadway Bridge to the homeless church make the food, bring the food and dish it out! We've been serving dinner under the bridge since November 2010 including a Thanksgiving meal and a Christmas Eve meal and party. The most difficult part of this project is predicting how many folks will show up - we've served as few as 40 and as many as 120.

WHY?

Simply put, we do this to feed people that are hungry. We also use

this time to build relationships with the homeless community. We feel that it's important to not just serve food but to treat those we are serving with love and respect and, if they are interested, to invite them to our church home to share meals and conversation there as well.

DO WHAT?

Volunteers are needed to do the following: cook the food, bring coffee or drinks, pick up (from the Eikon building) tables and setup beneath the bridge, transport serving ware, serve the food, and clean up.
